Lubbock Economic Development Alliance, Inc. Agreement with Copy Craft Printers, Inc. For the period from July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013

Background:

The Lubbock City Council established the Lubbock Economic Development Alliance, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as LEDA) to promote local economic development and stimulate business and commercial activity in Lubbock and the surrounding area. To this end, LEDA entered into a performance agreement with Copy Craft Printers, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as the "Company") on June 18, 2012.

The terms of the agreement provide incentives to the Company for the creation of new jobs. The general terms of the agreement allow the Company to receive up to \$64,500 for the creation of twenty (20) new full-time jobs in the Lubbock area. More specifically, the Company will earn incentives ranging from \$2,500 to \$10,000 for each job created according to LEDA's Sliding Scale over a five year period ending June 30, 2012 and maintained through June 30, 2017. The earned incentives will be paid out in one-fifth (1/5) increments as of each annual measurement date.

Objective, Scope and Procedures Performed:

Our objective was to determine if the Company met the job creation requirements of their agreement with LEDA. A summary of the procedures used is as follows:

- Reviewed the pertinent contract.
- Reviewed employee census data indicating names, dates of hire, dates of termination, work locations and compensation as of 6-30-12 (baseline date) & 6-30-13 (measurement date).
- Obtained the Texas Workforce Commissions (TWC) reports for quarters ending 9-30-12 through 6-30-13.
- Reviewed wages reported on the TWC reports to verify annual compensation levels and to corroborate dates of hire and/or termination.
- Discussed questions and issues raised as a result of the above steps with Company personnel.
- Discussed agreement interpretations with LEDA personnel.

Had we performed additional procedures, other matters might have come to our attention that would have been reported to you.

Results and Conclusions:

Per our review of the above data:

- The Company had sixty-nine (69) full-time Lubbock employees as of June 30, 2012.
- The Company had seventy-two (72) full-time Lubbock employees as of June 30, 2013
 - Of the net increase of three (3) full-time positions in Lubbock, the following met the specific compensation requirements for the various levels of incentives for the first measurement date.

Based on the above, the Company is currently entitled to receive one-fifth (1/5) of the total first year earned incentives of \$18,000, or \$3,600.
