Lubbock Economic Development Alliance, Inc. Agreement with Infection Controls, Inc.

For the period from September 1, 2013 through August 31, 2014

Background:

The Lubbock City Council established the Lubbock Economic Development Alliance, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as LEDA) to promote local economic development and stimulate business and commercial activity in Lubbock and the surrounding area. To this end, LEDA entered into a performance agreement with Infection Controls, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as IC) on August 15, 2011.

The terms of the agreement provide incentives to IC for the creation of new jobs. The general terms of the agreement allow IC to receive up to \$185,500 for the creation and maintenance of thirty-eight (38) new full-time jobs from September 1, 2011 through August 31, 2016. IC will earn incentives ranging from \$2,500 to \$10,000 for each job created according to an annual compensation schedule, and these incentives will be earned in one-fifth (1/5) increments as of each annual measurement date.

Objective, Scope and Procedures Performed:

Our objective was to determine if IC met the job creation requirements of their agreement with LEDA. A summary of the procedures used is as follows:

- Reviewed the pertinent contract.
- Reviewed employee census data indicating names, dates of hire, dates of termination, work locations and compensation as of 8/31/2014.
- Obtained the Texas Workforce Commissions (TWC) reports for quarters ending 12/31/2013 through 6/30/2014 and monthly payroll reports for the pay periods ending September 2013 & July-August 2014.
- Reviewed wages reported on the TWC reports to verify annual compensation levels and to corroborate dates of hire and/or termination.
- Discussed questions and issues raised as a result of the above steps with IC personnel.
- Discussed agreement interpretations with LEDA personnel.

Had we performed additional procedures, other matters might have come to our attention that would have been reported to you.

Results and Conclusions:

Per our review of the above data:

• IC had two (2) full-time Lubbock employees and two (2) part-time Lubbock employees as of September 1, 2011.

- IC had twelve (12) full-time Lubbock employees and three (3) part-time Lubbock employees as of August 31, 2012.
- IC had sixteen (16) full-time Lubbock employees and eight (8) part-time Lubbock employees as of August 31, 2013.
- IC had twenty-two (22) full-time Lubbock employees and ten (10) part-time Lubbock employees as of August 31, 2014. The twenty-two full-time employees had total compensation of \$651,262 for the twelve months ended August 31, 2014.
- Of the net increase of twenty (20) full-time positions in the Lubbock office, the following met the specific compensation requirements for the various levels of incentives:

Based on the above, IC is currently entitled to receive one-fifth (1/5) of the total third-year earned incentives of \$28,500, or \$5,700.
