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Procedures and Results

Background:

The Lubbock City Council established the Lubbock Economic Development Alliance, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as LEDA) to promote local economic development and stimulate business and commercial activity in Lubbock and the surrounding area. To this end, LEDA entered into a performance agreement with X-Fab Texas, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as X-Fab) on December 13, 2010.

The terms of the agreement provide incentives to X-Fab for the creation of new jobs. The general terms of the agreement allow X-Fab to receive up to \$337,500 for the creation and maintenance of seventy seven (77) new full-time jobs from March 1, 2011 through February 29, 2016. X-Fab will earn incentives ranging from 2,500 to \$10,000 for each job created according to LEDA's sliding scale. The earned incentives are to be paid out in one-fifth (1/5) increments as of each annual measurement date.

Objective, Scope and Procedures Performed:

Our objective was to determine if X-Fab met the job creation requirements of their agreement with LEDA. A summary of the procedures used is as follows:

- Reviewed the pertinent contract.
- Reviewed employee census data indicating names, dates of hire, dates of termination, work locations and compensation as of February 28, 2015.
- Obtained the Texas Workforce Commissions (TWC) reports for quarters ending March 31, 2014 through December 31, 2014, and obtained payroll registers from March 1, 2014 through February 28, 2015.
- Reviewed wages reported on payroll registers and TWC reports to verify annual compensation levels and to corroborate dates of hire and/or termination while comparing to employee census.
- Discussed questions and issues raised as a result of the above steps with X-Fab personnel.
- Discussed contract interpretations with LEDA personnel.

Had we performed additional procedures, other matters might have come to our attention that would have been reported to you.

Results and Conclusions:

Per our review of the above data and prior year agreed-upon procedure reports:

- At March 1, 2011, there were three hundred and eighty-three (383) full-time Lubbock employees and five (5) part-time Lubbock employees.
- At February 29, 2012, there were three hundred seventy-one (371) full-time Lubbock employees and five (5) part-time Lubbock employees.

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- At February 28, 2013, there were three hundred sixty-five (365) full-time Lubbock employees and four (4) part-time Lubbock employees.
- At February 28, 2014, there were three hundred sixty-one (361) full-time Lubbock employees and four (4) part-time Lubbock employees.
- At February 28, 2015, there were three hundred seventy-three (373) full-time Lubbock employees and seven (7) part-time Lubbock employees.

Based on the above, X-Fab did not exceed the baseline employee level of three hundred eighty-three (383) full-time Lubbock employees. Accordingly, X-Fab is not entitled to receive any fourth year incentives.
