














### **Annual New Residential Permits**




### FY 2023-24 Residential Permits




## **Average Home Sales**

#### Median Home Prices



#### Home Price Index – Lubbock MSA




# Texas Housing Affordability














#### Establishments – All Private Industries

#### Annual GDP 2012-2023


GDP (Gross Domestic Product): the total value of goods produced and services provided by Lubbock


### **GDP Per Capita**



# Overnight Room Demand




2004 – 2024 Lubbock Growth: 107.8%

# **Total Lodging Revenue**














2023 Top Goods Export Sector:

Agricultural products






#### **Cotton Production**

## Oil Rig Counts




